

NEW TRADITION: 1.975 RUN

In 2019, the Lambda Theta Alpha Foundation established an annual run as a key fundraiser to support the various Foundation pillars. The 1.975 Run invited supporters to walk or run 1.975 miles together to show their support towards advancing our community.



On June 30, 2019, for our inaugural 1.975 Run, 95 runners participated. 54 participants joined us virtually across the nation and 41 joined us live in Denver, CO. Proceeds generated from the run were used to support the Foundation's scholarship program.


PILLAR SUMMARY HUMANITARIAN RELIEF







